## GENERAL INFORMATION



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### Clothes

The School uniform, which is worn during weekdays by all girls with the exception of infants and those in the sixth form, consists of a blue/green tartan kilt with a blue blouse and tie. Boarders may wear casual clothes after School hours. The School outfitters are Lady Fair, Matlock. A clothing exchange shop is organised within the School and we are always pleased to offer help as necessary.

### Travel arrangements

Escorts are provided for girls travelling by coach to and from Derby station at the beginning and end of term and at half term, with a member of staff accompanying girls, usually by coach to Heathrow and to St. Pancras. Parents or guardians are responsible for girls' travel arrangements after that point.

### Exeats

At half term the School is closed and all girls go home or to their guardians. In addition there are certain exeat weekends when boarders may sleep away from the School. Boarders may also take "teavisits" on a Saturday or Sunday, being out from mid-morning until 8.30 p.m. Girls in the Sixth Form are allowed two extra optional exeats each term.

### Admission

The Headmaster is always pleased to meet parents and their daughters, arrange for them to see round the School and answer any queries they may have.

There is no entrance examination for those joining the pre-school and infants' department. Admission at the age of 8 plus to 10 plus is by means of the Junior Entrance Examination. Girls entering between 11 plus and 13 plus sit either the scholarship examinations, or the School's own admission examination. Those joining for the two year G.C.S.E. course sit the School's own entrance examination. Admission to the Sixth Form is dependent upon the results obtained at the G.C.S.E examination, a report from the girl's previous school and an interview with the Headmaster.

### Health

The health of the girls is in the overall charge of the qualified resident nursing sister and the housemistress. The School doctor holds a surgery at School twice a week or whenever required. In the case of an accident or serious illness where emergency treatment is required, every effort will be made to obtain parental approval prior to treatment. However, should this not be possible, the Headmaster or his nominee acting in loco parentis will give consent for such treatment (including anaesthetic or operation) as may be recommended by a doctor.

### Friends of St. Elphin's

"The Friends" is an association of parents both current and past, old girls, staff and governors, which helps and supports the School in many ways. Details of the Friends' activities and fund raising events are forwarded to parents from time to time.

The School reserves the right to remove an award from any candidate whose academic progress is deemed unsatisfactory as she moves through the school.

## FEES



### General

School fees are normally due for settlement on or before the first day of the term for which they are due, except for optional subjects and any extras for which accounts are rendered retrospectively. However, a subsequent paragraph outlines alternative methods for settlement of school fees.

A registration fee of £25 shall be forwarded with the entry form. This fee is non-returnable.

Upon acceptance, a confirmation of entry fee of £250 should be paid. This fee will be deducted from the first fee account.

In the case of a girl whose parents or guardians are overseas, a deposit of £1000 will be required one month before she enters the School. This sum will be available to use on her behalf in case of an emergency, in which case we would of course ask for it to be replaced as soon as possible. The deposit would be used to meet her final account, after which any balance will be returned.

A reduction of 5% is made for second daughters, and of 10% for third and subsequent daughters. Service families are offered a fee discount of 10%. These reductions are not applicable to Infants.

The above fees include:

- for all pupils - swimming, basic stationery, art materials and mid-morning drink
- for boarders - all meals including milk at night within Houses
- for day pupils - lunch and tea at School. (Lunches are not provided for Infants attending on a part-time basis).

In addition to fees, individual lessons in music, speech and drama are chargeable as taken. These may include:

Piano/forte, Violin and Violoncello, Organ and Wind Instruments: £98 per term for first instrument. £93 per term for second and subsequent instruments. Shared lessons £50 (two girls), £34 (three or more girls).

Private lessons in	£93 per term individual tuition
Speech and Drama or	£48 per term per pupil shared lesson (2 girls)
Solo singing	£33 per term per pupil group lesson (3 or more girls)

Tuition is also offered at the rate of £16 per hour to girls with dyslexia problems and to girls for whom English is not their first language.

Horse riding, tennis coaching, ballet, golf and driving lessons can also be arranged and will be charged as incurred.

### Notice of Withdrawal

A term's notice of withdrawal of a pupil is required to be given in writing to the Headmaster no later than the first day of term, otherwise full fees for the ensuing term are payable.

A half-term's notice in writing to the Headmaster must also be given if any change is desired in the arrangements for private lessons in music or speech and drama. Such notice should always be given by half-term, to take effect from the beginning of the following term.

Day pupils boarding on a casual basis are charged £11.00 per night for bed, breakfast and evening meal.

### Settlement of School Fees

1. School fees are normally due for settlement in full on or before the first day of term.
2. Alternatively:-
  - (i) Payment for basic fees may be made by standing order, whereby at the commencement of the academic year (September) an estimate is made of the year's total fees to which the amount 3.5% is added to cover administration and loss of interest to the school. One tenth of this total amount is payable by monthly bankers order for nine months leaving a final payment to be made for the balance of the year's fees in June.
  - (ii) Payment for sundries including extra tuition must be made termly on receipt of the account.
3. **For information.** Parents will find that some banks and some insurance companies operate School Fees Plans, which they might like to explore.
